Introducing Tarbiyah.education

A digital platform that utilises a variety of online learning methodologies to present information in an easy to understand and absorb format designed to be enjoyable as well as enlightening. As each lesson progresses, important points are summarised and reiterated, and supporting Qur'anic verses quoted to provide greater context for students. The children are also asked to engage in online activities designed to help them understand the key points of each lesson. There are also opportunities for extended learning through the memorisation and translation of du'a, with audio files of these presented as an aid to pronunciation and memorisation.

COMMUNICATION: CONTACT INFO

1. Please visit our website (<u>www.al-hujjat.ca</u>) on a regular basis to keep yourself informed of events, including emergency closures.

2. Please update the Study Centre if your contact information, including mailing address, phone number or email changes.

3. Canada's Anti-Spam legislation (CASL) requires that we ask permission before sending email updates. By signing the ISSC Guideline & Policy Agreement Form, you give the Study Centre permission to send you email updates.

4. While attending Virtual Classes, i.e google classroom and live classes, all rules and regulations that normally apply in a regular classroom onsite should be adhered to eg, hijab, classroom etiquette and discipline etc. Additionally, virtual class users are NOT allowed to post or share any materials from the virtual classes onto any sites or on social media. Violation to this rule will not be tolerated and violators will be dealt with using the Progressive Discipline approach (highlighted in the next page).

CONFIDENTIALITY:

Student information cannot be shared with anyone but the Parents or Legal Guardians of the student.

DRESS CODE:

All staff, parents, students and visitors must abide by the mandatory Islamic Dress Code (Hijab) of the Study Centres which is as follows:

Girls aged 8+ years – Must wear head covering, socks and flat, closed shoes, make up not allowed.

Girls aged 5–7 years – Must wear loose, long-sleeved tops reaching below their thighs, loose pants, socks, closed shoes and head scarf.

Boys – Must wear plain, long-sleeved, loose shirt, long pants with belt, socks and flat shoes or sneakers (No tight or ripped clothing, no skinny jeans, no graphics on shirts, no baseball caps, no earrings).



GUIDELINES FOR GOOGLE CLASSROOM AND ZOOM

- Students will be provided with a separate Zoom link every week for Tarbiyah/Diniyat and Quran.
- Every Sunday from 10:30AM-1:00PM, students must attend their classes. Each student will have two 45-minute Tarbiyah Classes (10:30AM-12:00PM), and one 60-minute Quran class (12:00PM – 1:00PM).
- Teachers will post the homework, and content on student's Google Classroom.
- Attendance is mandatory. If students cannot make it to the class, please let the teacher or admin know in advance that the student won't attend.
- Be positive, polite, and courteous
- > Participate in class discussions as directed by teachers, via chat or voice
- Review posts each week using link in e-mail or accessing the online classroom OR by downloading <u>free google classroom App</u> on your phone and getting notifications every time something is posted.
- Students to complete and submit assignments by due date
- Ask questions if you are not sure or don't understand

PROGRESSIVE DISCIPLINE POLICY

Student misbehavior will be dealt with using the **Progressive Discipline** approach. This is a process which includes information gathering and the consideration of mitigating circumstances. Decision making follows on how to support the student in ways which promote positive, productive behaviour.

BULLYING

The Study Centres define bullying, as defined by the Ministry of Education: A form of repeated, persistent, and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual that is intended to cause fear and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem, or reputation.

SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION

Where a student has committed one or more of the infractions below, the Principal may consider suspension or expulsion:

- 1. Bullying (as defined above).
- 2. Swearing at a teacher or person in a position of authority.
- 3. Committing an act of vandalism causing property damage.
- 4. Missing or skipping class (truancy) or leaving Study Centre premises without permission (appropriate sign-out process).



- 5. Uttering a threat to inflict serious bodily harm on others.
- 6. Smoking on Study Centre premises or possessing/ being under the influence of alcohol/ illegal drugs.
- 7. If the student has demonstrated through a pattern of behaviour that she/he is persistently resistant to making positive changes in behaviour.
- 8. An act or pattern of behaviour considered by the principal to be injurious to the moral tone and/or to the physical or mental well-being of others at the Study Centre.

CODE OF CONDUCT – STUDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- 1. Complying with the Code of Conduct and all Policies.
- 2. Demonstrating positive, respectful, inclusive and responsible behaviour and excellence in Akhlaq at all times.

The Kalima with Meaning

لا إلَهَ إلا الله

Lā ilāha ilallāh: There is no god but Allāh

مُحَمَّدٌ رَسُولُ اللَّه

Muhammadur Rasulullāh: Muhammad is the Messenger of Allāh

عَلِيٌّ وَلِيُ اللَّه

Aliyyun Waliyullāh: Ali is a Special Friend of Allāh

وَحِيُ رَسُولِ اللَّه

Wasiyyu Rasulillāh: Ali is the representative of Rasulullāh

وَ خَلِيْفَتَهُ بِلا فَصْل

Wa Khalifatahu bilā fasl: and his immediate successor

The Prophets – Ulil 'Azm & Books Revealed

We now know that Allāh sent 124,000 anbiya (prophets) to guide us.

Out of all of these *anbiya*, five prophets are very special. They are called the **Ulil 'Azm** Anbiya.

The Ulil 'Azm Prophets are:

- 1. Nabi Nuh ('a)
- 2. Nabi Ibrahim ('a)
- 3. Nabi Musa ('a)
- 4. Nabi 'Isa ('a), and
- 5. Rasulullāh Muhammad (s)



Allāh also sent Four Books to Guide us:

First Allāh sent: Tawrat to Nabi Musa ('a).

Then Allāh sent: Zabur to Nabi Dāwud ('a).

Then Allāh sent Injil to Nabi 'Isa ('a).

And finally, Allāh sent the Qur'ān to Rasulullāh Muhammad (s).

People changed the first three books. But, the Qur'ān is the miracle of Allāh given to Rasulullāh (s). Allāh protects the Qur'ān and no one can ever change it or write a book like the Qur'ān. The Qur'ān will remain forever until the world comes to an end.

14 Ma'sumeen ('a) and 12 Imams ('a)

Allāh sent 124,000 messengers to teach us what is good and what is bad so that Allāh will be happy with us and we can go to Jannah and live there happily forever.

The last messenger is Rasulullāh (s). After Rasulullāh (s), Allāh gave us 12 Imāms and Sayyida Fatima az-Zahra ('a), the daughter of Rasulullāh (s), to guide us and teach us the Qur'ān and what is halāl (allowed) and harām (not allowed) in Islam.

The 12 Imāms and Sayyida Fātima az-Zahra ('a) are the family of Rasulullāh (s). They are called the Ahl al-Bayt ('a) of Rasulullāh (s). And all together they are called the 14 ma'sumeen ('a).

So the 14 fourteen ma'sumeen ('a) are:

- Rasulullāh Muhammad (s)
- Sayyida Fātima az-Zahra ('a) 1
- And 12 Imāms <u>+ 12</u>

Usul ad-Dín – There are 5 Roots of Religion

1. Tawhid: Means there is no god but Allāh. We believe in One and Only One Allah.

2. Adālah: Means Allāh is Just and Fair. He never does wrong to anyone.

3. **Nubuwwah**: Means **Prophets**. Allāh sent 124,000 Anbiya (Prophets) to guide us.

4. **Imāmah**: Means there are **12 Imāms** after the Last Prophet – Rasulullāh (s) – to guide us and to teach us the Qur'ān.

5. **Qiyāmah**: Means after the world ends, there will be a final **Day of Judgement** (Yaum al-Qiyāmah). On this Day, Allāh will bring everyone back to life and judge everyone if they were good or bad in this world. The good will then go to Jannah (Paradise) and live there forever and the evil will go to Jahannam (Hellfire).

<u>Salah – Prayers</u>

Name of Prayer	Number of Rakaats	When it needs to be recited
Fajr	2	From dawn to before sunrise
Dhuhr	4	From midday (when sun is between halfway between sunrise and sunset) to about 4 min. before sunset
Asr	4	After enough time has passed to pray salat–al- Dhuhr to before sunset
Maghrib	3	About 10 – 15 min. after sunset to last few min. before middle of night (halfway between sunset and fajr)
Isha	4	After enough time has passed to pray salat-al-Maghrib to before middle of night (halfway between sunset and fajr)
